With only two weeks until the start of early voting and 33 days left until Election Day, the NC Association of School Administrators (NCASA) wants to make sure you have a plan in place to make your voice heard in the 2020 elections! NCASA encourages each member to register to vote and/or check your current voter registration, as well as research candidates on your ballot to see where they stand on critical education issues. Members should pay extra attention to the race for State Superintendent of Public Education and your local board of education races. IMPORTANT DATES

- **Friday, October 9** — Regular Voter Registration Deadline
 - Voter registration forms must be postmarked or delivered to your county board of elections office by 5 p.m.
- **Thursday, October 15** — Start of One-Stop Early Voting
 - Voters may register and vote at any one-stop early voting location in their county of residence.
- **Tuesday, October 27** — Deadline To Request an Absentee Ballot
 - Absentee ballot requests must be received by your county board of elections office by 5 p.m.
- **Saturday, October 31** — One-Stop Early Voting Ends
 - One-stop early voting sites close at 3 p.m.
- **Tuesday, November 3** — ELECTION DAY
 - Absentee mail-in ballots must be postmarked on or before Election Day.
 - Polls will be open from 6:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. for in-person voting.

- **Vote By Mail** — To request an absentee ballot, complete the NC Absentee Ballot Request Form at ncsbe.gov and email, fax, mail, or return it in person.
